Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Metanoia.....this is a word that has come up several times lately. It reminds me of the first time I heard it which was on a teen Christian retreat (Deco TEC). The kids loved the word!!!!!! It is kind of a fun word, it rolls off the tongue and sounds kind of crazy.

Wikipedia gives the following definition: “Metanoia, a *transliteration* of Greek is “a transformative change of heart; especially; a *spiritual conversion*.”

It further states...“The term” ... was used *consistently in the literature of that time to express a fundamental change in thinking that leads to a fundamental change in behavior and/or way of living.*: In 2006, an ecumenical group of scholars published a study of repentance in the Bible and the Church. After “a thorough examination of Hellenistic Jewish writings,” the study found that for Jews living at the time of Jesus, “repentance” meant “a fundamental change in thinking and living.” For the New Testament, this change is a necessary ingredient in accomplishing God’s plan for salvation and community for everyone.

March 10 is Ash Wednesday and the following Sunday is the beginning of the church’s Lenten season. We will be combining Ash Wednesday with the first Sunday of Lent; and as we do so, I would like for us to keep metanoia in mind. While Ash Wednesday is a time we typically think of as a time of fasting, the giving up of something, I am asking us to not give up but give more. I would ask that we give more time to prayer maybe give up a timeslot in your day and replace it with prayer.

Pray.....ask for metanoia in God’s church, in our church, in your families and in ourselves. We live in a world that is hurting. A world that is dying. A world that is broken. A world where His light needs to shine. I pray in this season that we ask God for metanoia.....His metanoia! That in His metanoia we can strive as a church, as individuals to overcome our own wills and practice living and doing God’s will.

God’s blessings in love to all of you! God is Good! All the Time!!!

Minutes from New Hope UMC Administrative Board

January 16, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 6:05 p.m. by John Kafer, who led the opening prayer. Present were: Rick Johnson, John Kafer, Michelle Merchant, Tom Litzner, Joan Williams, and Len Overholt.

Minutes from the November 21, 2018 meeting were reviewed. Motion to approve the minutes by Rick, seconded by Joan and approved.

The Treasurer's report was presented by Len Overholt. Our fund balance was decreased by \$2245 in November, and increased by \$1179 in December. Motion to approve the report for both November and December was made by Tom, seconded by Rick and approved. John noted that final revenue for 2018 was \$6147 short of budget, considerably better than the \$15k shortfall budgeted as an investment to move our church forward.

Communications – John shared information from the UMC website re: the special session to be held at UMC General Conference in February to move towards a way forward as the US church decides how to reconcile the church with issues of human sexuality and inclusion for LGBT members and attendees. There was considerable discussion and by consensus, it was decided to provide the same information to our congregants as a half sheet insert in Sunday's program, and to leave a hard copy of the report being considered in the foyer for review. It was agreed that, though New Hope has not yet confronted this issue, it is a matter of time til we do.

Finance – John and Len presented the budget as recommended by the Finance Committee meeting Jan 13, reflecting expense of \$88,574. With actual 2018 revenue of \$88,353, the 2019 budget feels attainable, with the possibility that revenues beyond \$88k would further strengthen our position for the future. Motion to approve the budget by Tom, second by Joan, motion carried.

Pastor Michelle reported that the Trustees have been unable to meet re: the lingering issue of the Funeral Policy. Without the clear recommended action of that committee, the issue was tabled til the next meeting. She also reported a restructuring of our participation in the Pellston school concessions, with our continued participation a positive.

Women of New Hope held their Christmas party at the Church Wednesday, December 5th.

Old Business Michelle is reviewing licensing issues re: music through CCLI that may be relevant to our live streaming of music on Facebook.

There was no new business.

Motion to adjourn was made by Joan, seconded by Len, and carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:55.. The next meeting is Feb 20, 2019 at 6 p.m.

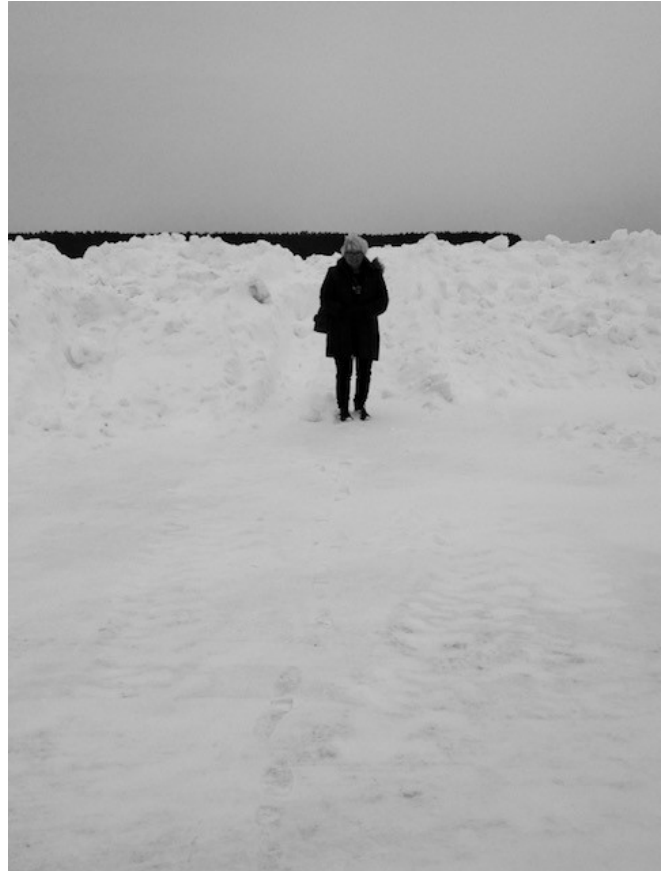
Pastor Michelle closed the meeting with a prayer.

February 20, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 6 p.m. by John Kafer, who led the opening prayer. Present were: Jason Frye, Avis Jensen, Rick Johnson, John Kafer, Tom Litzner, Michelle Merchant, Keith Osborn, Leonard and Susan Overholt.

Minutes from the January 16, 2019 meeting were reviewed. Motion to approve the minutes by Tom Litzner, seconded by Keith Osborn and approved.

The Treasurer's report was presented by Len Overholt. Our fund balance was decreased by \$868.36 in January. Motion to approve the report was made by Keith Osborn, seconded by Jason Frye and approved.

Lay Leader Jason Frye will have his schooling done in three months.
